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NORTH TARRANT EXPRESS OPENS NEW 35W RAMP ADDED MOBILITY FOR FORT WORTH

FORT WORTH, Texas – Mobility continues to improve in Fort Worth as the North Tarrant Express project opened a new ramp from eastbound I-820 to the northbound I-35W TEXpress lanes. The ramp opened Wednesday, September 1.

This newly built ramp in the 820/35W interchange will create greater mobility and additional access for the TEXpress Lanes, as well as providing more options for motorists as they travel through the region. The new direct connector is part of the larger managed lane network that has been built in North Texas and keeps improving mobility in the area by providing motorists with more choices on how to reach their destination.

In July 2018, North Tarrant Express (NTE) 35W Segment 3A project was opened, two months ahead of schedule. The \$1.6 billion project, provides drivers the option to travel along the newly rebuilt and expanded 35W or the NTE 35W TEXpress Lanes from downtown Fort Worth to North Tarrant Parkway. The new corridor connects to the North Tarrant Express project along I-820 (North Loop) and SH-121/183 (Airport Freeway) adding an additional 13-miles to the NTE TEXpress Lanes in Northeast Tarrant County.

Motorists can expect to see other enchancements occurring at the I-35W/I-820 interchange and along Mark IV Parkway at I-820 as part of the expanding North Tarrant Express project.

North Tarrant Express 35W is considered a critical infrastructure sector. As the project continues, staff, contractors and construction workers are following specific guidelines to ensure the health and safety of all employees due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the growing traffic.
